

School District- C4C Community Council

The C4C Council is comprised of lay leadership from twelve area churches that fall within one school district. One high school and five feeder schools provide education in this rural county. The six schools have individual C4C Council representatives, who serve as point persons. They provide communication to the C4C Council, the churches, and the school. Church coordinators from the other represented congregations on the council participate, as well. These representatives meet with prospective school administration, counselors, social workers, and other assigned contacts to develop plans of support. The council meets regularly to organize and provide support.

Services

Poverty Awareness

C4C sponsored a poverty seminar for the area congregations and schools.

Summer neighborhood lunches provide an opportunity for members to provide lunch daily in the summer in high-need neighborhoods, and getting to know families, gaining first hand understanding of the challenges faced by families.

K-3 Literacy

A school-based mentoring program has been initiated at one of the elementary schools. Volunteers from area churches provide weekly mentoring with 45 students.

Students who were provided summer meals received books throughout the summer, building home libraries with 1,000's of books.

A book mobile is provided in the summer months.

Basic Needs

High School Clothing Closet – monitored and managed by the council

College Dorm Kits are provided to each student in need

Daily lunches are provided all summer to more than 200 children in area neighborhoods.

Weekend Food Backpack program provided as needed

Food boxes provided during long school holiday breaks
